Giving Back: South Intensive Transition School Collaborates With C.A.R.E To Announce 2013 Scholarship Recipients

South Intensive Transition School teamed up with the Caribbean Educators' Association, Inc. (C.A.R.E), a non-profit organization that awards scholarships annually to eligible graduating seniors of the School District of Palm Beach County. Applicants are awarded scholarships based on a very rigorous application and interview process. The scholarships are announced through high school guidance counselors and a select committee processes the applications and conducts the interviews.

As a community service initiative, the scholarship interviews were held at South Intensive Transition School and coincided with a FCAT 2.0 Writing Boot Camp for 8th and 10th graders on Saturday, February 23, 2013. The SpringBoard Writing Workshop activities that were utilized during the FCAT 2.0 Writing Boot Camp offered teachers and students guided experiences in specific rhetorical and grammar and usage skills, emphasizing practice and mastery of specific writing modes. It provided additional direct writing instruction to support and extend mastery of the writing process and commonly assessed written products. Each workshop guides students through the writing of three separate texts in the specific mode being taught: one that is constructed as a class with direct guidance from the teacher, one that is peer constructed with teacher support, and one that is written independently.

"Students who attended received intensive instruction in the areas of planning, developing details and support, conventions, focus and organization. They were highly engaged, motivated and very successful in their efforts. I look forward to seeing the FCAT 2.0 Writing scores when the results are released!" said High School SpringBoard English Language Arts teacher Jacqueline Major.



C.A.R.E members conduct two major fundraisers each year: a *Taste of the Caribbean* and the scholarship event in March. This year's *Taste of the Caribbean* will be held on Saturday, December 7, 2013 at Lake Pavilion (located at 101 South Flagler Drive, West Palm Beach, FL 33401).

For the past eight years, C.A.R.E has awarded 60 scholarships to students who have pursued post-secondary studies at a variety of institutions ranging from vocational/technical programs to prestigious colleges and universities. The recipients of these scholarships have demonstrated impressive academic skills, have an outstanding Grade Point Average and have dedicated many hours to community service hours.

The mission of C.A.R.E is to make a positive difference in the lives of others through a supportive network of educators and other professionals. "The goals of C.A.R.E include continuously recruiting members to strengthen the network and to be a support system to fellow educators and other professionals," said C.A.R.E Vice President Elsa Lubin.
